1. WELCOME AND PRAYER

Brian welcomed everyone and Father Berry opened the meeting with a prayer. Gillian read out the apologies for the meeting.

2. MINUTE

The minute from last year's AGM were approved and taken as read.

3. REVIEW OF THE YEAR 2016-2017

b) Summer Mass Schedules:

e) Fete:

Father Berry advised that Tracy and John are happy to organise the church Summer fete 2018 and he wished to offer his thanks to them both and to all involved in making the 2017 fete a great success.

The fete raised £1900 and using these funds he planned to re-do the lighting in the church hall and repaint as well. Also an outside light is to be erected to provide lighting at the side road to the church house and garage area.

4. **COUNCIL MEMBERSHIP**
